

WHO IS INVOLVED?

Workers at the Milk-Bone facility in Buffalo, New York are represented by BCTGM Local Union 36G. Over 165 workers at the facility make a wide variety of Milk-Bone pet products and have been represented by the BCTGM since 1957.

WHEN DID THE STRIKE BEGIN?

Workers hit the picket line at 12:00 a.m. on October 28, 2024. The Company and the Union had been negotiating a new contract since September 23.

WHAT IS THE MAIN ISSUE?

Affordable Health Insurance: Employees entered negotiations hoping to improve their current health insurance policy. Instead of offering improvements, Smucker's actually came to the bargaining table with a worse policy that would cost employees more. To make matters worse, during last ditch negotiations to reach a deal, the company actually took a step backwards and offered an even worse proposal than their original offer.

Unfair Labor Practice Charges Filed with Federal Government. The Union filed labor charges against Smucker's for regressive bargaining and for trying to intimidate and threaten workers who chose to legally go on strike.

WHO OWNS MILK-BONE?

Milk-Bone is owned by food giant J.M. Smucker Co., which had sales over \$8 billion dollars in 2024 because of well-known brands including: Jif peanut butter, Uncrustables sandwiches, Folgers coffee, Hostess snack cakes, Smucker's jam/jelly, and pet food products including Milk-Bone, Meow Mix and Puperoni.

J.M. Smucker is run by CEO Mark Smucker. Over the last three years, Mr. Smucker has raked in over \$30 million dollars in executive compensation.
